National Education Policy 2020 envisages an education system rooted in Indian ethos that contribute directly to transforming India in terms of economic growth; social justice and equality; scientific advancement; national integration and cultural preservation. As the first education policy of the 21st century, it proposes the revision and revamping of the existing education structure to create a new system that is aligned with aspirational goals of 21st century education.

Emphasizing the role of higher education in promoting human as well as societal well-being, the policy highlights the need of developing an enlightened, socially conscious, knowledgeable and skilled nation by developing 21st century capabilities across a range of academic disciplines including professional, technical and vocational acumen. Reflecting on the challenges faced by the higher education system in the country, the policy envisions a complete overhaul and re-energizing of the higher education system to deliver high quality higher education with equality and inclusion.

NEP also recognizes the advantages of technology for the future generation as it necessitates the need of alternate modes of education through online/digital platforms to not only uplift the quality of education but to also address the inequalities of access. The Institute of Lifelong Learning (ILLL) has a clear mandate to develop, facilitate and sustain intellectually stimulating multimedia content based learning aligning with ethos and vision of University of Delhi. The mandate becomes all the more significant in the current scenario when the University has geared itself to implement the recommendations of NEP 2020 in Higher Education.

Acknowledging the insights and vision of NEP 2020 to unleash the potentials of ICT, the Institute of Lifelong Learning proposes a two day webinar to explore the role of ICT in delivering equitable and quality lifelong learning.
